If you wish to train to be a social worker or practise as a social worker in the ROI, contact the National Social Work Qualifications Board (NSWQB). The NSWQB is responsible for maintaining and promoting the quality of social work education and training in the ROI. NSWQB can also tell you about training courses, policy issues, job opportunities and how to become accredited to work in ROI. In order to practise as a professional social worker in ROI, those who have qualified outside of the ROI, must apply to the NSWQB for accreditation of their non-national qualifications. The process can take up to 2-4 months and therefore it is recommended that you apply well in advance of the point of planned employment.
